DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE RESEARCH AND DATA ON MILITARY ECONOMIC ISSUES AND OUTCOMES

Supporting the unique needs of the military community requires us to understand and track their access to economic tools as well as economic outcomes. The National Telecommunications and Information Administration's <u>Digital Nation Data Explorer</u> offers a window into understanding computer and internet use of veterans, and their <u>Digital Equity Resource for Veterans</u> guide shares effective inclusion practices that promote equitable digital outcomes.

The U.S. Census Bureau's <u>Veteran Employment Outcomes (VEO)</u> explorer is a data visualization tool sharing statistics on labor market outcomes for recently discharged Army veterans, and could be expanded in the future to other services. In addition, a plethora of U.S. Census Bureau <u>data</u>, <u>publications</u>, and <u>news</u> surrounding veteran issues can be explored.





The Department of Commerce has a variety of resources to support members of the military community including transitioning service members, military spouses, veterans, and military/veteran service organizations with the goal of facilitating economic empowerment for those who serve the nation.
