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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Hurricane Sandy hit New Jersey (NJ) on October 29, 2012. Several months after the storm stakeholders were still assessing the damage and the long-term economic effects on the region. To help with this effort, the Economic and Statistics Administration developed this report which provides baseline information on demographic and economic conditions in these areas. This report was requested by Commerce's Economic Development Administration (EDA) who, with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), is guiding the Federal effort to assist these areas in immediate and long-term recovery efforts. EDA provides these reports to state and local government officials who use them to develop a basis for justification for Federal assistance while EDA uses them to help determine their distribution of grants in the disaster area.

This report provides several pre-Sandy baseline economic indicators. **Population** by age and sex and **Income**—median household income, poverty rates and per capita personal income—are provided for 2011 for each affected county **Employment by industry** for industries with paid employees and the self-employed are available and provided for 2010. **County government revenue and expenditures** are available for only a few of the counties in both NJ and New York (NY) for 2007. **Federal contract award data** by county are available for FY2012 and **revenue and employment of firms headquartered** in these counties for 2012 are provided at the end of this report and not summarized here.

Few sources of post-Hurricane Sandy data are available; however, monthly **Unemployment rates** are provided by county starting in 2011 and extending to the months following the hurricane. Also, the Federal Reserve Bank of New York (FRBNY) has created a monthly **index of coincident economic indicators** (CEI) for the NY and NJ region that measures post-Sandy economic activity.

Population: Although population migration does not appear to be an issue like it was post Hurricane Katrina in 2005, one recurring population theme in the counties of NJ and N Y was that population growth of all age categories changed modestly, less than plus or minus one percent per year, between 2006 and 2011 except for the 60 to 74 age range which grew quite rapidly at about 3 to 5 percent per year. This growth in the senior citizen population has growing implications on sources of income, primarily as transfer payments are a growing source of income for this age category.

Income and Poverty Rates: In general, income in both N J and most of the affected counties in NY was higher than the national average as measured by either median household income or per capita income. Family poverty rates were significantly higher than the national average in some of the lower income counties in N J, but mostly less than the national average in the selected counties in N Y. As expected, family poverty rates were inversely related to income. Counties with the highest poverty rates include Essex County (NJ) at 14.4%, almost 3 percentage points above the national average and Bronx County (NY) at 28.1%, over twice the national average of 11.7% for that year.

• Median household income in the NJ was \$67,458 in 2011, about \$17,000 above the national average.

- Counties with median household income far below the state average were primarily concentrated in the southern half of the state and included Atlantic, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Ocean and Salem, with median incomes ranging from \$50,829 (Atlantic) to \$57,784 (Camden). Households in a few northern counties including Essex, Hudson and Passaic also had below average median incomes.
- Counties with median household income substantially above the state average were primarily located in the northern half of the state and include Bergen, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Somerset and Sussex with incomes ranging from \$73,890 (Mercer) to \$99,099 (Hunterdon). The two southern counties in this category include Burlington and Gloucester.
- Median household income in NY was \$55,246, over \$4,700 above the national average. Counties with median household income well below the state average include the Bronx (\$32,058), Kings (\$42,752) and Sullivan (\$47,978) counties.
- Counties with household income above the state average include Nassau, Putnam, Rockland, New York, Orange, Richmond, Suffolk and West Chester with incomes ranging from \$66,224 (Orange) to \$91,414 (Nassau).

Similar disparities in income and sources of income by county can be seen in the tables and maps in the average **per capita income** section of this report. In general, the average per capita income in a county declines, the sources of its income become more stable reflecting the larger share of transfer payments as a source of its income.

Unemployment Rates: Monthly unemployment rates in the affected counties over the past two years vary widely. Some counties have had persistently high rates of unemployment while others are well below the national average.

- Since early 2012, **NJ** unemployment rates have been about 1 to 2 percentage points higher than the national rate, ranging from 8.7% to 10.0% (on a monthly basis).
 - Counties with an unemployment rate lower than the state average include Bergen, Burlington, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Somerset, Sussex and Warren.
 - Unemployment rates in Atlantic, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Essex, Gloucester, Hudson, Ocean, Passaic, Salem and Union counties continue to track higher than the state average.
 - Counties showing a substantial increase in their unemployment rate post-Sandy include Atlantic, Cape May, Ocean and Salem. While these counties have seasonal fluctuations in unemployment that normally peak in winter months, December 2012 unemployment rates were on average one full percentage point higher than the previous December.
 - For a majority of the counties, however, unemployment rates are lower post-Sandy, but are not much changed from December 2011 rates.

- The **NY** unemployment rate followed closely with the national rate for the last two years, ranging from 7.7% to 9.1%. Of the affected counties selected for this report, Bronx, Kings and Sullivan had unemployment rates consistently higher than the state average.
 - Post-Sandy, however, saw a reduction in the unemployment rate for Bronx and Kings counties, but an increase for Sullivan county.
 - All of the remaining selected counties in NY either had an unemployment rate close to or below the state average. Post-Sandy unemployment rates were slightly lower for these counties, but not much different from December 2011 rates.

Figure ES-1 shows the NYFRB's CEI index, one of the few post-Sandy <u>regional economic indicators</u> available. This indicator is composed of data on employment and earnings and is calculated separately for NJ, NY and New York City (NYC). The FRBNY CEI index shows a modest increase in economic activity in NYC and NY state since Hurricane Sandy and an even stronger increase in economic activity in NJ.



Figure ES-1. Indexes of Coincident Economic Indicators for the New York-New Jersey Region

- In December 2012, the CEI index for NYC increased by 1.8% at an annual rate following a 2.3% increase in November and resulted in an annual increase of 3.7%.
- For the entire state of NY, the December 2012 CEI index increased by 2.4% following a 0.1% decrease in November. Over the past year the CEI index for NY increased by 1.7%.
- In December 2012, the CEI index for NJ increased by 3.7% following a 2.3% increase in November. For all of 2012, the CEI index for NJ increased by 1.5%. For NJ, then, the CEI index indicates that economic activity in the two months after the storm showed a fairly dramatic improvement over the annual average.

INTRODUCTION

Hurricane/Tropical Storm Sandy caused widespread damage after it came inland near Atlantic City, New Jersey on October 29, 2012. (Figure 1.) This report and the data provided do not attempt to assess the economic impact of this storm or determine its long-term consequences, but were put together at the special request of the Economic Development Administration (EDA) of the Department of Commerce¹. EDA requested that county summaries of demographic and economic data be provided for all twenty-one (21) counties in New Jersey—Atlantic, Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Essex, Gloucester, Hudson, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, Passaic, Salem, Somerset, Sussex, Union and Warren—and thirteen (13) counties (boroughs) in New York—Bronx, Kings, Nassau, New York, Orange, Putnam, Queens, Richmond, Rockland, Suffolk, Sullivan, Ulster and Westchester. EDA requested this data in order to assist them, and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), in allocating resources to these areas as these counties attempt to recover.



Hurricane Sandy pounded areas of the U.S. with high population and great economic activity compared to other parts of the country. In 2011, New Jersey and New York represented about 9 percent of the

¹ In December 2012, the Bureau of the Census provided the EDA and FEMA with much more data on the area than are provided here. The request, at the time, resulted in a vast assembly of demographic and economic data for New Jersey, New York and Connecticut that was refined to the Census geography of "block groups" from their American Community Survey (ACS). At this level of geography, the ACS data provided was from the Census' latest five (5) year average data-2006 through 2011. Our report is at the county/borough level only and provides summaries for these areas. The data in our report are from the latest data series available, including the data from the ACS.

population and over 10 percent of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP). In terms of GDP per capita, New York ranked 5th and New Jersey 8th compared to other states. For comparison, California ranked 14th and Pennsylvania 28th. Connecticut, another state with extensive damage from the hurricane ranked 4th. These data are provided for comparison purposes only and are representative of economic activity of the population on a state basis.

Content of Report

A summary of demographic and economic data are presented here for the counties identified earlier. Demographic (population) data are provided by age and sex. Income levels are provided for the working population as well as estimates of median household income and family poverty rates. Unemployment rates are provided monthly going back to January 2011 through the latest available, preliminary data for December 2012, and compared with unemployment rates for the state as a whole as well as the nation. Industry data is provided at the county level for the top 25 industries with paid employees as well as the top 25 industries for non-employer firms. For both of these, industries are ranked by employment.

NOTE: The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) made its annual historical revision of county level unemployment rates after the writing of this report; therefore, unemployment rates and rates of change cited here may differ slightly from currently published BLS unemployment rates.

The tables at the end of this paper include (1) county government revenue and expenditures; (2) county average per capita income, including sources of income; (3) Federal government contract awards by county and (4) firms headquartered in the Congressional Districts (CD) that are associated with these counties. Limited government revenue and expenditure data are available at the county level. In New Jersey, county revenue and expenditure data are provided for eight (8) counties including Atlantic, Cape May, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean and Union. In New York, two counties—Nassau and Suffolk—are covered, as well as New York City. Average per capita income is by county is provided since the data are available for the sources of income, including Government transfer payments. Federal government contracts data by county are provided for latest awards, the number of open contracts by county and the top three (3) contracts in these counties by Federal agency, firm, location, industry and value of contract. The top firms by CD provide the firm name, industry, number of employees, headquarter location and revenue in 2012. The CD title provides the counties associated with the CD.²

Purpose

The purpose of assembling this volume of data is to provide both EDA and FEMA with a description and a context of the demographic and economic characteristic of these counties prior to the storm. While

² As footnoted at the section on firms, a county to CD concordance is not provided primarily because in most cases portions of counties are allocated to CDs. Firm headquarter addresses, therefore, should be used to confirm its location within a county.

the data are extensive, they are certainly not all inclusive. For instance, housing and home value data are not provided here. This report aims to provide a picture of economic activity and not to measure the existing capital stock prior to the storm. For each county, a "bulleted" narrative summary precedes the data and charts.

New Jersey Counties

All 21 counties in New Jersey were declared by FEMA as being eligible for individual and public assistance as a result of damage from Hurricane Sandy. Figure 2 shows a county map of New Jersey and identifies counties that rank highest and lowest in terms of median household income and unemployment rate. A demographic and economic summary for each of these counties follows in alphabetical order.



Figure 2: New Jersey Counties Affected by Hurricane Sandy

Atlantic County, New Jersey

Below are baseline demographic and economic data for Atlantic County:

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was 274,338, slightly higher than in 2006. However, the 60-74 year age group grew over 3 percent per year.
- Median income in the county was \$50,829 and the poverty rate was 10.8%. Average per capita personal income was \$40,262-62% from earnings and 23% from transfer payments.
- The **unemployment rate** in NJ has been as high as 2 percentage points above the national rate since 2011 while the county's unemployment rate has ranged from 2.5 to 5.3 percentage points above the national and state unemployment rates during this period. Just prior to the hurricane, the unemployment rate in the county was 12.9%. By December 2012 the county unemployment rate had started its usual seasonal increase; however it jumped to 14.3%, almost two percentage points higher than in December 2011.
- Tourism-type **industries** dominate this county with Accommodations (hotels and motels) being the largest followed by Food services. The Health care sector follows.
- In 2010, the number of self-employed in Atlantic County was 15,680 (reported as number of establishments) with combined revenue of \$705 million. The top three non-employer industries were Real estate, Professional services and Personal services. Together these three comprised 36% of county employment and 40% of the revenue.
- Atlantic County had **revenue** of \$1.5 billion and **expenditures** of \$1.4 billion (2007).
- Federal contracts in FY2011-12 were \$253 million. In FY 2012, there were 554 contract awards in the county. The largest 3 contracts in the county were from DOT for Computer and Engineering Services.
- **Top Firms headquartered** in the county's Congressional District (CD) 2 were in Travel and tourism.

Bergen County, New Jersey

Below are baseline demographic and economic data for Bergen County:

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was 911,004, slightly higher than in 2006. However, the 60-74 year old age group grew at 3 percent per year. Bergen County ranks as the county with the highest population in New Jersey.
- Median income in this county was \$79,272 and poverty rate was 5.0%. Average per capita personal income was \$66,096-71% from earnings and 11% from transfer payments.
- The **unemployment rate** in NJ has been as high as 2 percentage points above the national rate since 2011 while Bergen County's unemployment rate has ranged from 1.9 percentage points below to 0.6 percentage points above the national and state unemployment rates during this period. Just prior to the hurricane, the unemployment rate in the county was 8.1%. In December 2012 the county unemployment rate fell to 7.7%, which was below the NJ state unemployment rate of 9.3% and above the national average of 7.6%.
- Health care, Professional services and Food services were the **largest industries** in the county.
- In 2010, the number of self-employed in Bergen County was 31,275 (reported as number of establishments) with combined revenue of \$412 million. The top three non-employer industries were Ambulatory health, Professional and Personal services. Together these three comprised 44% of county employment and 49% of the revenue in that year.
- No data available for **county government revenue and spending**.
- Federal contract awards for FY2012-13 were \$891 million while the number of contract awards was 4,823. Largest two contracts were from DOT for Engineering Services and DoD, Transportation Equipment Rental, respectively.
- Largest firms headquartered in CD 5 associated with this county were for Health care and Retail.

Burlington County, New Jersey

Below are baseline demographic and economic data for Burlington County:

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was 449,576 only slightly higher than in 2006. However, the 60-74 year old age group grew 3.5 percent per year.
- Median income in this county was \$72,896 and the poverty rate was 3.5%. Average per capita personal income was \$48,318-71% from earnings and 16% from transfer payments.
- The **unemployment rate** in NJ has been as high as 2 percentage points above the national rate since 2011 while Burlington County's unemployment rate has ranged from 0.6 percentage points below to 1.7 percentage points above the national and state unemployment rates during this period. Just prior to the hurricane, the unemployment rate in the county was 9.2%. By December 2012, the county unemployment rate had fallen slightly to 9.1%, below the NJ state unemployment rate of 9.3% and well above the national average of 7.6%.
- The top two industries in this county were Professional services and Food services, respectively.
- In 2010, the **number of self-employed** in Burlington County was 25,916 (reported as number of establishments) with combined revenue of almost \$1.4 billion. The top three non-employer industries were Professional services, Real estate, and Specialty trade contractors. Together these three comprised 40% of county employment and 50% of the revenue.
- County government revenue and expenditure were not available.
- Federal contract awards in FY2011-12 were \$3.6 billion, the second largest in the state. The number of contract awards was 5,817 (2012). The top three were from DoD.
- The **top three firms headquartered** in CD 3 associated with this county were in Environmental services, Retail and Finance.

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was 513,241 was unchanged in 2006 with the exception of the 60-74 year old age group which grew just under 4 percent per year.

Cape May County, New Jersey

Below are baseline demographic and economic data for Cape May County:

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was 96,601 down slightly from 2006. Population declined in all age groups except for 60-74 year-olds which grew 2.7 percent per year.
- Median income in this county was \$53,256 and the poverty rate was 6.6%. Average per capita personal income was \$48,694—53% from earnings and 24% from transfer payments.
- The **unemployment rate** in N J has been as high as 2 percentage points above the national rate since 2011 while Cape May County's unemployment rate has varied seasonally, ranging from just 1.1 percentage points below to 8.8 percentage points above the national and state unemployment rates. Bronx County, New York

Below are baseline demographic and economic data for Bronx County:

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was just under 1.4 million, slightly higher than in 2006. However, the population in the 60-74 year old age group grew almost 3 percent per year over the five-year period.
- Median income for this county is \$32,058 and the poverty rate is 28.1%. Average per capita personal income was \$31,788—56% from earnings and 34% from transfer payments.
- The **unemployment rate** in NY was slightly below the national rate in 2011 but has been higher than the national rate since early 2012. The unemployment rate in Bronx County has ranged from 2.7 to 5.5 percentage points above the national and state unemployment rates during this period. Just prior to the hurricane, the unemployment rate in the county was 12.4%. In December 2012 the county unemployment rate fell slightly to 11.9% but remains much higher than the NY state unemployment rate of 8.2% and the national average of 7.6%.
- **Top industries** in this county are Health Care, Education and Social Assistance.
- In 2010, the number of self-employed in Bronx County was 110,416 (reported as number of establishments) with combined revenue of \$ 2.7 billion. The top three non-employer industries were Social assistance, Personal and laundry services, and Administrative and support services. Together these three comprised 48% of county self-employment and 24% of the revenue.
- **County government revenue and expenditures** were not available. However, New York City shows total revenues of \$100 billion and expenditures of \$88.6 billion (2007).
- **Federal contracts** in FY2011-12 were \$34.5 million. The number of contract awards in FY2012 was 158 and the largest contracts were from DVA and DoD.
- The **top firms headquartered** in CD 13 associated with this county were Oil, gas and coal; Consumer products and Travel services.

Westchester County, New York

Below are baseline demographic and economic data for Westchester County:

- The total **population** in the county in 2011 was 955,899, slightly higher than in 2006. However, the population in the 60-74 year old age group grew by 3.3 percent per year.
- The **median income** in the county was \$77,006 and the **poverty rate** was 7.5%. Average **per capita personal income** was \$75,855–67% from earnings and 11% from transfer payments.
- The **unemployment rate** in NY was slightly below the national rate in 2011 but has been higher than the national rate since early 2012. The unemployment rate in Westchester County has ranged from 0.3 to 2.5 percentage points below the national and state unemployment rates during this period. In December 2012 the county unemployment rate fell slightly to 7.1% but remains lower than the NY state unemployment rate of 8.2% and the national average of 7.6%.
- The largest industries in this county were Professional services, Health care and Food services.
- In 2010, the **number of self-employed** in Westchester County was 90,288 (reported as number of establishments) with combined revenue of \$5.6 billion. The top three non-employer industries were Professional services, Real estate and Personal services. Together these three comprised 44.4% of county self-employment and 54.3% of the revenue in that year.
- County government revenue and expenditures were not available.
- **Federal contracts** in this county for FY2011-12 were \$65.6 million. The number of contracts awarded in FY2012 was 650 and the three largest were from DoD and DVA.
- The **top firms headquartered** in CD 16 and 17 associated with this county are in Consumer Products, Metals and mining and Wholesale trade.

County per Capita Personal Income By Source of Income

Table 39 provides information on county per capita personal income and sources of this income in New Jersey. The three sources of income are (1) earnings (wages and salaries), (2) transfer payments (from Governments including supplemental security benefits, unemployment insurance and retirement benefits including pensions) and (3) dividends, interest and rents. While the differences in levels of per capita income between the counties are striking, the variation in sources of income can be used in determining the stability of income in the county.

For example, Table 39 shows that Somerset County had the highest county per capita income--\$73,011—in the state in 2011. About 75 percent of that income was directly from wages and salaries. Only 8 percent of the county per capita income was from transfer payments and the remaining 17 percent of the income was from dividends, interest and rents. Thus, this up-state county was highly dependent on the stability of their job base. On the other hand, Cumberland County per capita income is less dependent on wages and salaries for its income. This down-state county with the lowest per capita income in the state--\$35,272—was dependent on wages and earnings for only 61 percent for its income while stable transfer payments accounted for 27 percent. Thus, while Somerset County is the wealthier county, its income may be dependent on the hurricane damage to the source of production and demand. Cumberland County, while being the poorer county, should be able to sustain its income through a relatively higher share of transfer payments. Figure 38 provides a picture of the distribution of average per capita income in New Jersey showing the concentration of wealth in the northern half.

Table 40 provides information on county per capita personal income and sources of this income in New York. Like the preceding table on New Jersey, Table 40 shows similar disparities in income and transfer payments. For example, two adjacent counties—New York and Bronx counties—provide the most compelling example of this. New York County had the highest average per capita income in New York of \$121,301 and less than 10 percent of this can be attributed to transfer payments. Bronx County, on the other hand, had the lowest per capita income--\$31,788—for the selected counties in New York. In Bronx County, however, over one-third of this income was from transfer payments.
