Dear Honorable Tribal Leader:

The Department of Commerce has a long-standing policy relating to government-togovernment relations with tribal governments. On January 26, President Biden issued a Presidential Memorandum on Tribal Consultation and Strengthening the Nation-to-Nation Relationships that requires the Department to submit a plan for implementing Executive Order (E.O.) 13175, which charges all executive departments and agencies to engage in regular, meaningful, and robust consultation with Tribal officials in the development of Federal policies that have Tribal implications.

The Department's "Tribal Consultation and Coordination Policy of the U.S. Department of Commerce" (Policy) is available online at <u>https://www.commerce.gov/bureaus-and-offices/os/olia/native-american-affairs</u>. The Policy serves as an over-arching policy for all bureaus and agencies under the Department. I am writing to request your recommendations and feedback on our current Policy and included questions on how we can improve our policies and practices to better engage with Indian Country through meaningful consultation.

The Department will hold two national tribal consultation webinars on April 14 and April 15, 2021, to listen to tribes on their recommendations and comments on our current Policy and request your participation. This webinar will also provide updates on our current tribal consultation officials for each bureau and agency. Please feel free to extend this invitation to other key tribal officials.

As the President's memorandum states: "History demonstrates that we best serve American Indian and Alaska Natives when Tribal governments are empowered to lead their communities, and when federal officials speak with and listen to Tribal leaders in formulating federal policy that affects Tribal Nations." I believe this is one of many steps we will take to strengthen our relationship with you. Consultation times, dates, and links are below:
