CLASS DEVIATION FROM THE FEDERAL ACQUISITION REGULATION

Determination and Findings

In accordance with Civilian Agency Acquisition Council (CAAC) Letter 2024-02, "CAAC Consultation to Issue a Class Deviation From the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Regarding Certification of Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Concerns," the Department of Commerce is authorizing a class deviation for the means of verification that an offeror is eligible for consideration for a set-aside or sole-source award under the Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Program (SDVOSB Program).

Findings

- On November 29, 2022, and July 3, 2023, the Small Business Administration (SBA) published final rules that established 13 CFR 128 regarding status as a Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) concern to be eligible for an award under the Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Program (SDVOSB Program).
- Beginning January 1, 2024, to be eligible for an SDVOSB set-aside or sole-source award, a concern must:
 - o Be certified by SBA as an SDVOSB concern; or
 - Have both represented that it is an SDVOSB concern and have submitted a complete application for SDVOSB certification to SBA on or before December 31, 2023.
- The FAR currently requires contracting officers to use SAM.gov to determine if SDVOSB concerns are eligible for SDVOSB set-aside or sole-source awards. SAM.gov will not be updated on January 1, 2024, to reflect the SBA certifications or pending applications.
- The procedures outlined in CAAC Letter 2024-02 should be followed until SAM.gov is updated to reflect the SBA's certification.
