Pathways Internship Program

The Pathways program places currently enrolled students, from high school to graduate level, into paid and unpaid opportunities working in federal agencies. Students who successfully complete the program may be converted to a permanent position. Pathways Recent Graduate Program

The program places individuals who have graduated within the past two years from qualifying educational institutions or programs into 1-year developmental experiences. Pathways Presidential Management (PMF) Fellows Program

The PMF program places outstanding candidates from all academic disciplines who have received a qualifying advanced degree within the preceding two years into two-year fellowships.
