

## RESTRICTIONS AFTER LEAVING FEDERAL SERVICE

After leaving Federal service former Government employees are subject to some restrictions, primarily limiting contacting the Government on behalf of others. The restrictions vary based on the employee's position and pay level.

1 year 2 years 5 years forever

use or disclosure of nonpublic information

contact Federal agencies on specific-party matters on which employee worked

contact Federal agencies on specific-party mat ters under official responsibility

serve as a registered foreign agent for a foreign government or political party

contact former agency

rep/advise foreign gov't

lobby a political appointee in the Executive Branch

(for President's term)

lobby former agency

work for the Federal Government

get pay from contractor

work for a financial aid recipient

obtain patent rights

restrictions for all employees are in GREEN

restrictions for all senior employees\* are in RED

restrictions for all political appointees in PURPLE

restrictions for all employees who receive a buy-out are in BLACK

restrictions for procurement officials of \$10,000,000 procurements are in GRAY

restrictions for EDA employees are in YELLOW

restrictions for USPTO employees in ORANGE

- \* base pay > \$166,340 or Executive Schedule
- all employees are barred from receiving payments for Federal representational activities by others (partners) when the former employee was in Federal service
- attorneys must comply with bar rules
