Duties



This Attorney-Advisor position on the Energy Transition team will support investment into sustainable renewable energy, distributed energy, and transmission and distribution networks. This work will involve advising foreign governments around the world on the policies, laws, regulations, contracts, and standards for them to rapidly adopt new clean power generation, transmission and distribution infrastructure; incorporate solar, wind, hydrogen, geothermal, and storage resources into a grid; and structure financeable power projects in accordance with international best practice. This work will also engage foreign governments to transition to low and zero-carbon energy sources and to mitigate emissions and decarbonize existing energy sources such as through CCS and carbon markets.

This Attorney-Advisor will consult with senior foreign government officials; assess development needs and barriers to investment; and design, implement and evaluate legal reform technical assistance programs that meet the host countries' economic development needs and are in line with U.S. energy and climate policy goals; collaborate across US Government agencies and support the US State Department's Power Sector Program and Energy and Minerals Governance Program and USAID's Power Africa program. Conditions of Employment

- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- Juris Doctor (J.D.) degree from an ABA-accredited law school.
- Provide proof of an active bar membership in good standing of the bar of a state, a territory of the United States, the District of Columbia, or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. On-line information is allowed as long as it shows that applicant is in "active" status.
- Successfully pass a background investigation. This may include a credit check, a review of financial issues, as well as certain criminal offenses and illegal use of possession of drugs.
- Required to submit a Confidential Financial Disclosure Report, OGE Form 450
- Complete a 2-year trial/probationary period- Registered for Selective Service, if applicable (www.sss.gov).
- If you receive a conditional offer of employment for this position, you will be required to complete an Optional Form 306, Declaration for Federal Employment, and to sign and certify the accuracy of all information in your application.

Qualifications

Qualification requirements in the vacancy announcements are based on the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) Qualification Standards Handbook, which contains federal qualification standards. Applicants must possess one year of specialized experience equivalent in difficulty and responsibility to the next lower grade level in the Federal Service. Specialized experience is experience that has equipped the applicant with the particular competencies/knowledge, skills and abilities to successfully perform the duties of the position. This experience need not have been in the federal government.

Experience refers to paid and unpaid experience, including volunteer work done through National Service programs (e.g., Peace Corps, AmeriCorps) and other organizations e.g., professional; philanthropic, religious; spiritual; community, student, social). Volunteer work helps build critical competencies; knowledge, and skills and can provide valuable training and experience that translates directly to paid employment. You will receive credit for all qualifying

experience, including volunteer experience.

To qualify at the **GS-13/14**, applicants must have acquired the amounts of skills and experience indicated below:

GS-13:

- At least two years of relevant legal experience in the energy sector, most helpfully power
 generation and transmission. In this position, Attorney-Advisors will be expected to be able

- Drafting or review of transactional documents in the energy sector, in particular the power sector. - At least four years of relevant legal experience in the energy sector, most helpfully power

 generation, and transmission infrastructure projects.
- Drafting or review of transactional documents in the energy sector, in particular the power sector. You will be evaluated for this job based on how well you meet the qualifications above.

Applicants will be rated based on their education, experience, demonstrated legal research and writing abilities, and performance during the interview process. Basis for evaluation: If eligible and meeting basic qualifications, your application package will be evaluated in conjunction with your resume and supporting documents for the required knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) to successfully perform the duties of this position:

- Knowledge of research strategies and techniques sufficient to research the most complex legal issues.
- Knowledge of the controlling statutes, regulations, and case law pertaining to the subject matter of the particular issue sufficient to develop legal opinions whether through the litigation process or administratively, which may alter the state of the law in the particular area or expand the charter of the agency.

Please be advised that Department of Commerce Attorney positions are in the Excepted Service. As such, these positions are not covered by the usual civil service hiring procedures. You will be evaluated for this job based on how well you meet the qualifications stated herein. We will perform an initial review of applications to determine basic eligibility and minimum

qualifications for the position and numeric scores will not be assigned. There are no numerical rating systems through which to apply veterans' preference; however, the Office of the General Counsel favorably considers veterans preference eligibility in hiring. Applicants eligible for veterans' preference are encouraged to include that information in their cover letter or resume. If selected, additional information may be required.

- **Copy of law school transcript.** (Unofficial copy is sufficient, but official copy must be submitted before appointment). You are not required to submit official documents at this time; copies are sufficient.
- **Certificate of bar membership and proof of good standing.** Prior to receiving an offer, you will be asked to provide a certificate of bar membership and proof of good standing.
